

UNIVERSITY HONORS PROGRAM & TRANSFER CURRICULUM ?

These activities are designed to support a student's transition to UC Davis, and assist in developing relationships within the academic discipline and other areas of interest.

UHP Requirement

- Fall: First-Year Transfer Seminar specific to honors
- Winter/Spring: Two additional activities

Learning Outcomes

- Seminar: Assist student success both in and out of the classroom through introduction to campus resources, research, faculty mentorship, and fostering community
- Activities: Engage in actions that align with your values, academic and professional goals
- Generate ideas and plans for a Significant Work (thesis/project).


Activity Options

- Community Service: Opportunity to foster a sense of civic responsibility and pride in your community. This is an
 unpaid, non-credit bearing experience.
- Honors Contract: Faculty mentored project or study based on a previously taken upper division course. This is one-unit, lettered graded course.
- Individually Designed Project: Internship or volunteer experience that enhances your professional development.
- Project Management Course (counts as two activities): Client and team based experiential learning. This is a three-unit, letter graded course.
- Research Preparation, Conduct & Communication Course: Instruction that prepares students for their signature work. This is a one-unit pass/no pass graded course.
- Center for Leadership Learning, Diversity Leadership Development Program: Workshops built to develop a
 deeper understanding and appreciation of differences, effectively address complex issues and cultivate a safe
 and inclusive environment in an organization; earn a diversity leadership certificate.
- Center for Leadership Learning, Student Leadership Development Program (counts as two activities): An
 immersive experience that integrates competency-building and project-based learning; earn a leadership
 development certificate.
- Washington Program: Study and intern in Washington DC during the academic year or summer.
- Study Abroad: Study abroad through UC Davis or the University of California Education Abroad Program during the academic year or summer. Program must be at least four-weeks in length.

The Signature Work is a student's opportunity to engage in a topic through a thesis or project, and communicate the results through a written document and oral presentation.

UHP Requirement: Signature Work

- Signature Work Options
 - Thesis in Major/Engineering Design Project (preferred)
 - UHP Thesis
 - UHP Project

Signature Work Learning Outcomes

- Identify a research question/project, define the scope of the objectives, design the experiment(s)/activities, conduct analysis and communicate the results.
- Defend the methodology chosen for the topic/strategy used to conduct the project.
- Reference relevant background information and data pertinent to the topic.
- Utilize new skills and techniques specifically learned for this work.
- Apply appropriate theory to findings and/or data, and use these interpretations to draw conclusions related to the stated objectives.
- Demonstrate responsible, professional demeanor with respect to the planning, management, participant, and execution of the work.
 Be responsive to feedback and guidance from the faculty sponsor.
- Employ presentation and writing skills to communicate the purpose, scope and conclusions.
